

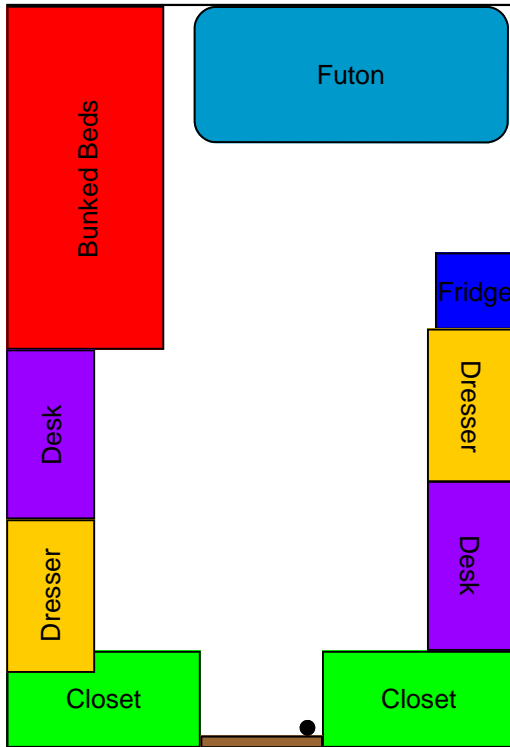
# **ROOM DESIGNS**

## Bill and Adam's Room

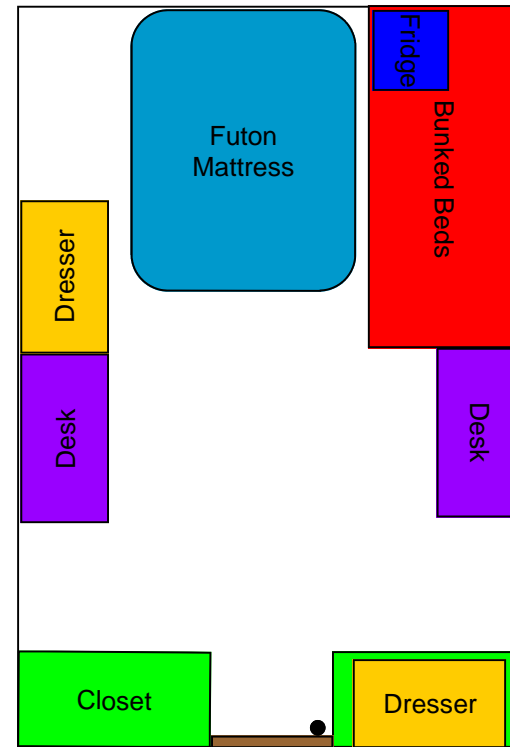


### Description

By placing a TV on top of the dresser, this arrangement provides ample seating area for watching a movie or playing a game. You gain lots of storage space by putting things under the bunked beds or futon. For maximum storage space, you could loft the futon and place the refrigerator underneath!



## Joe and Ty's Room

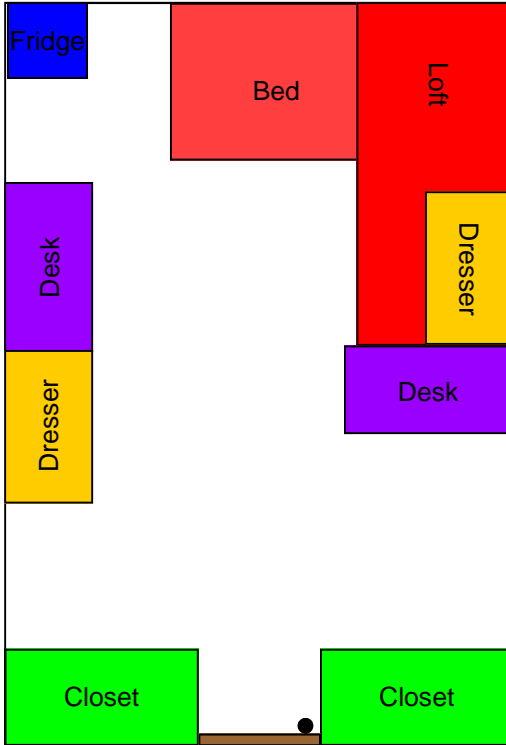


### Description

With the futon on the floor, this room provides über sleeping space. This room design is also conducive for having a bunch of friends chill because of the ample, comfy floor space.



## Jamie and Min's Room

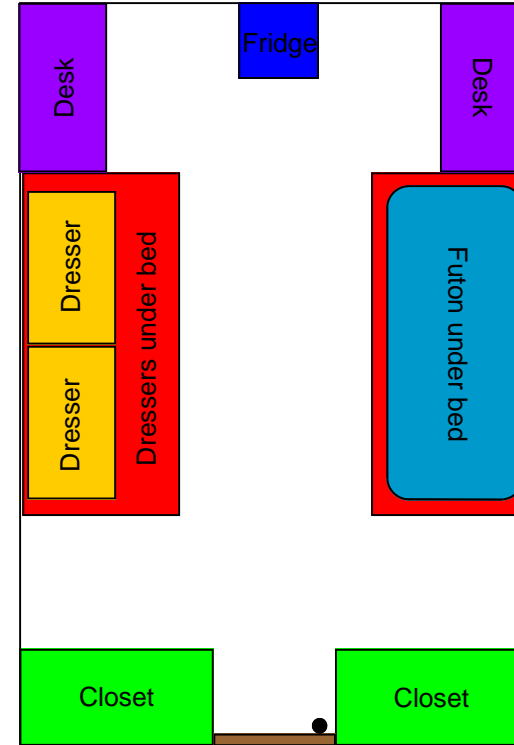


### Description

The corner arrangement of beds here is nice, the desk near the top bunk can be used to hold an alarm clock for easy access to the snooze button. There is also additional space along the walls for anything large you brought with.



## Mark and Josh's Room



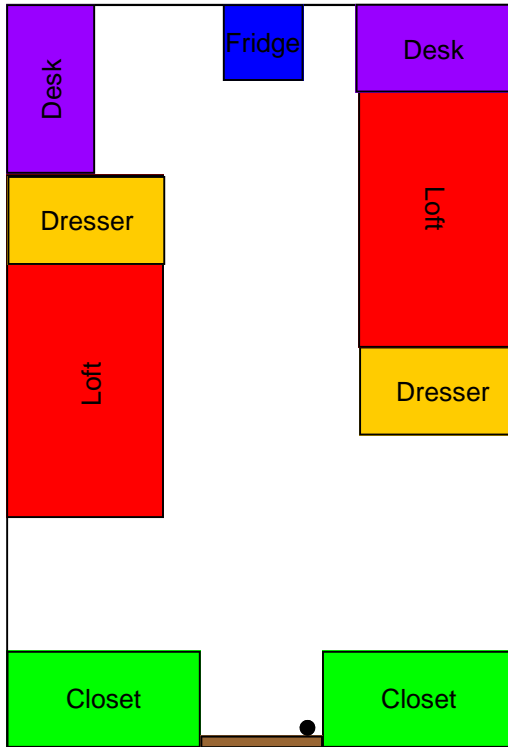
### Description

This room layout is a very standard layout for roommates first getting to know each other. Keeping everything to your own side prevents early disagreements, and having both beds lofted provides lots of space.





## Jon and Joe's Room

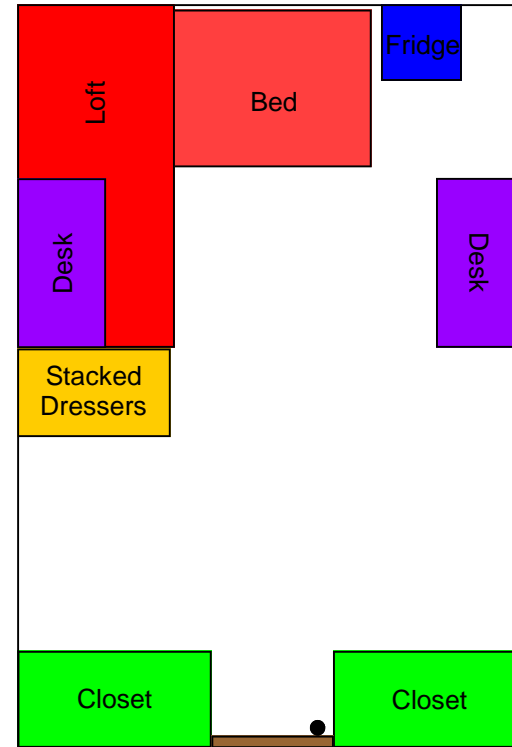


### Description

This is one of the more straightforward room designs. The food source and microwave are kept in the center for easy access from both sides, and there is a large amount of open floor space beneath the beds to allow for chairs to be placed underneath for visitors. The TV is replaced by a desktop computer with a 50 dollar TV Tuner, and though it does free up more space be warned that there isn't really a convenient place to put a conventional TV set.



## Sean and Johnny's Room

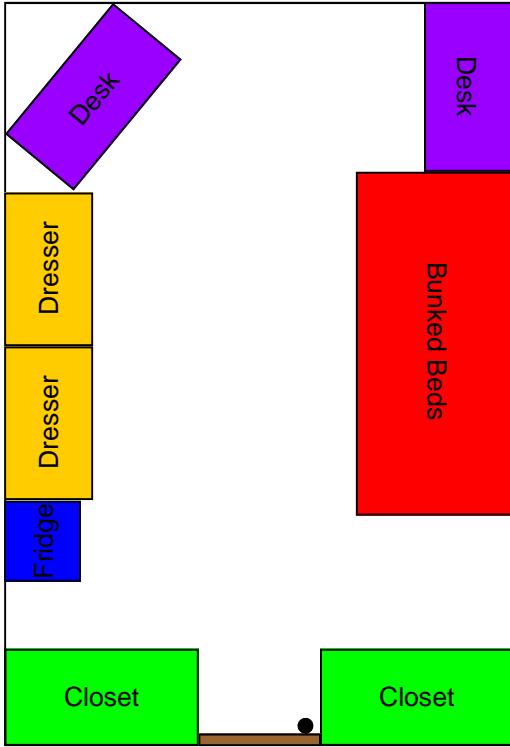


### Description

The best part about this room is the double stacked dressers, which conserves space and stabilizes the bed. The L-shape in the corner also keeps the room more open and allows for light. Note—tall dressers are not a good idea for short people. = D



# Anant and Aaron's Room

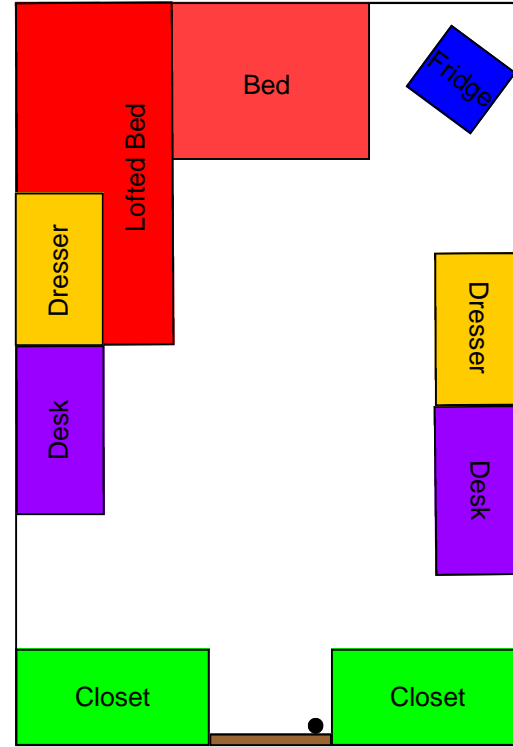


## Description

This is a cozy set up which utilizes the lower bed as a couch and a dresser as a TV stand. The angled desk allows the person to see the TV easily, and adds something different to the usual dimensions. This is a great room for those who didn't bring a lot to the dorms.



# Matt and Mike's Room



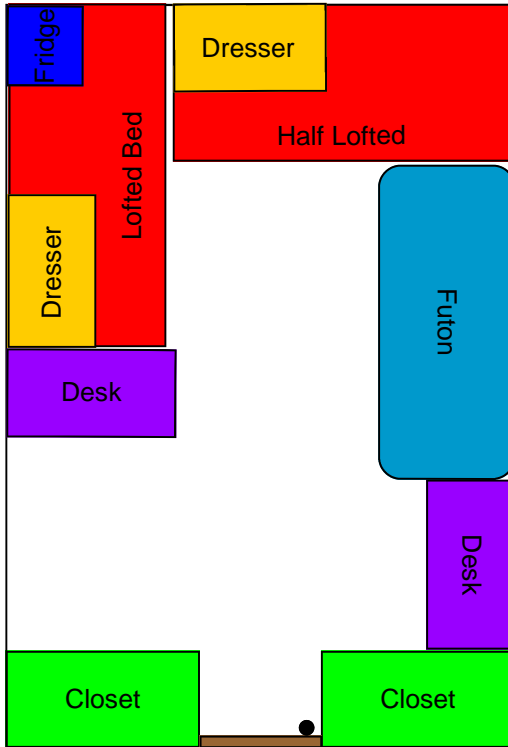
## Description

For people without a futon, this layout allows the beds to be used as seats for watching a movie on the TV on the dresser. There's also lots of room in the middle for a party, and one person gets to enjoy sleeping close to the ground.





## Katie and Tara's Room

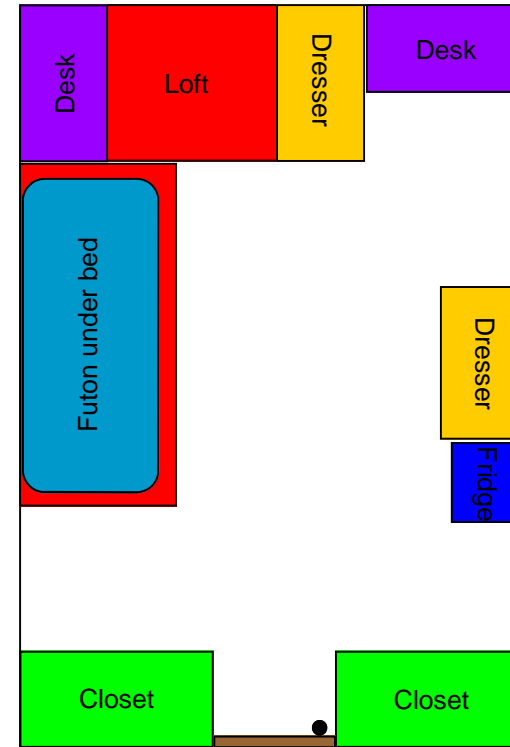


### Description

Lofting the other bed only halfway creates varied levels in your room and also allows this bed to be used as seating for the TV. Having both beds lofted gives you flexibility on how you want the desks to be placed, but keeping one down has the advantage of letting in more light through the window.



## Renee and Marie's Room

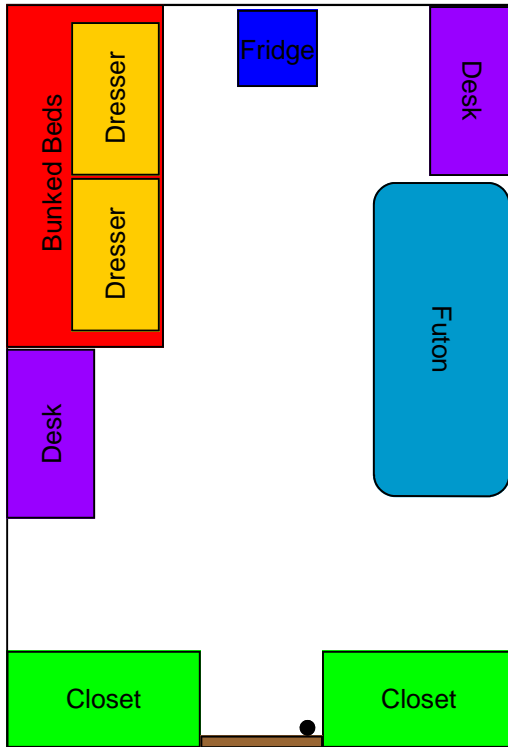


### Description

The corner desk/dresser area makes a great workspace, and the futon under the bed is good for studying, watching TV, or just hanging out. Renee also had the genius idea of putting foam tubing around the bar at the edge of the bed for those of us who constantly hit our heads on it when getting up.



## Rachel and Eleni's Room

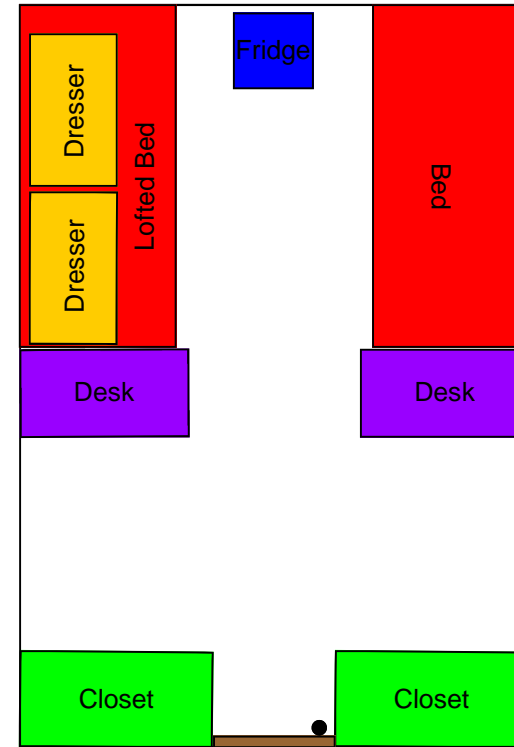


### Description

By putting the dressers under the bed, you can save space for whatever else you have, and the futon is placed in a way that it can easily be pulled out for a bed without being in the way, in case you have a guest or just don't feel like climbing up to your bed.



## Chris and Mark's Room



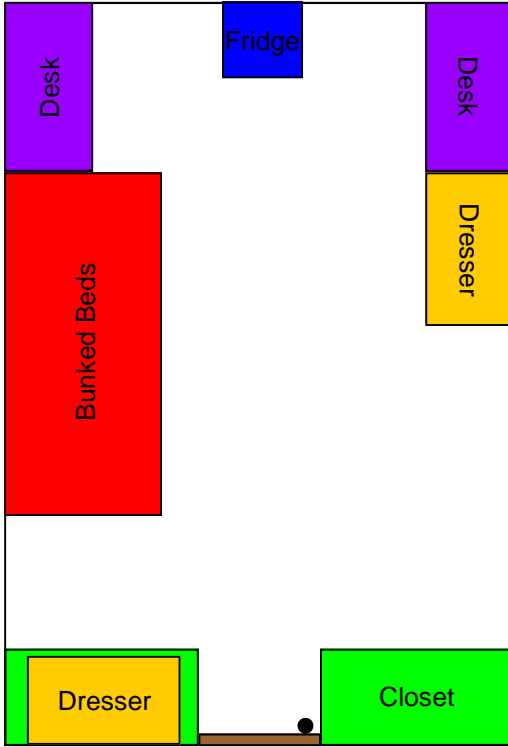
### Description

For those without a futon, this arrangement allows one bed to be used as seating for watching TV. Roommates also get to keep their own stuff on their own side, for those of you that like your own space. The extra room by the closets allows for additional storage devices you may have brought.





## Chris and Dave's Room

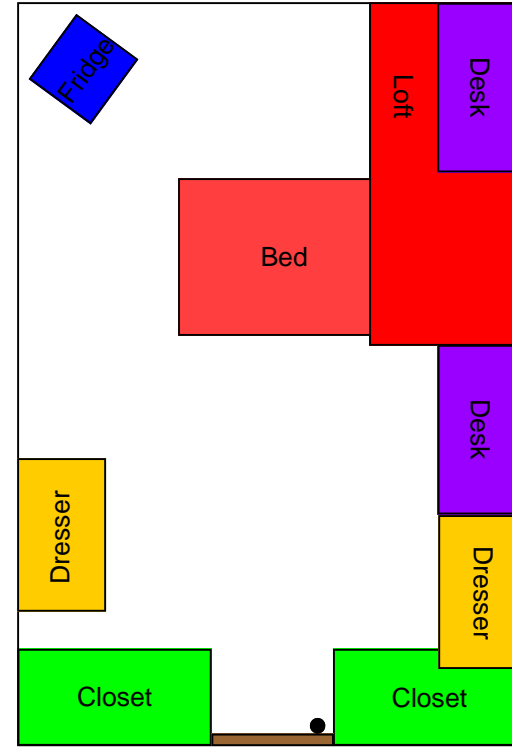


### Description

## Shannon and Ashley's Room



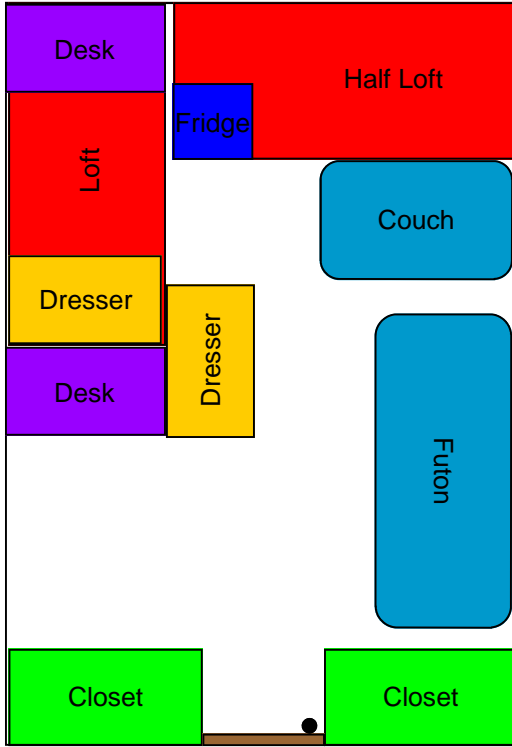
### Description

## Devin and Dave's Room

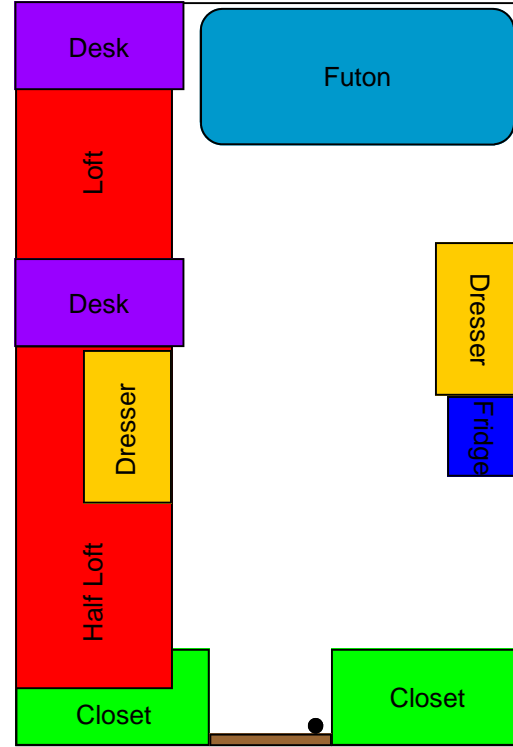


### Description

## Erin and Kelly's Room

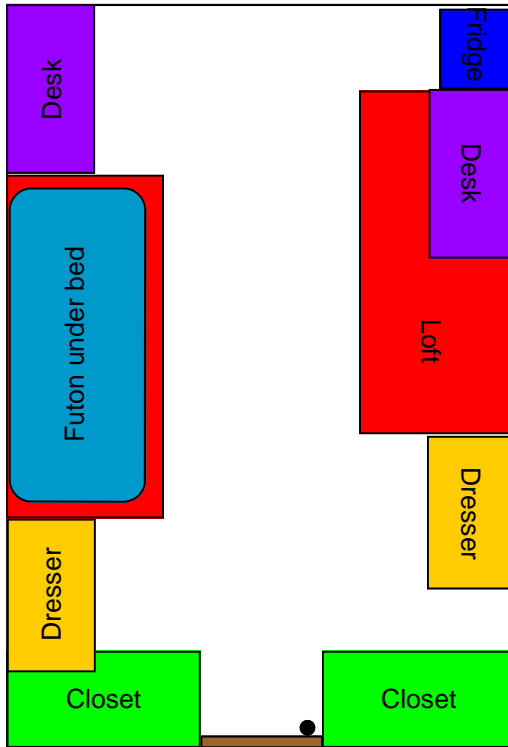


### Description

## Emily and Rachel's Room

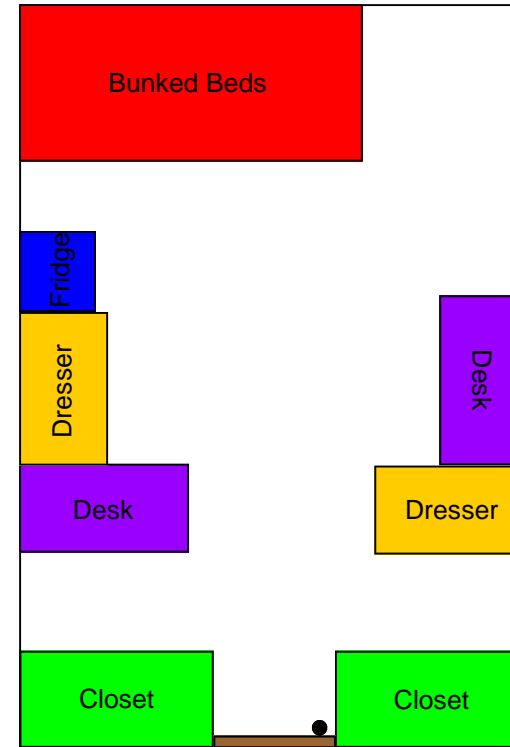


### Description

## Josh and Joey's Room



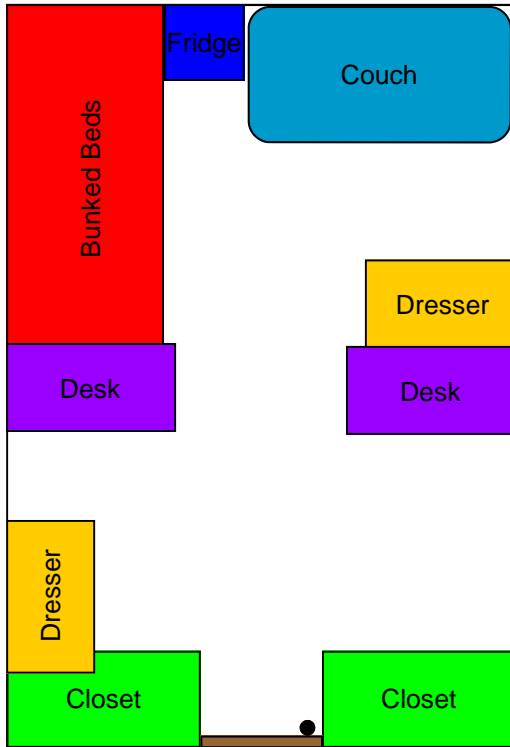
### Description

# Matt and David's Room

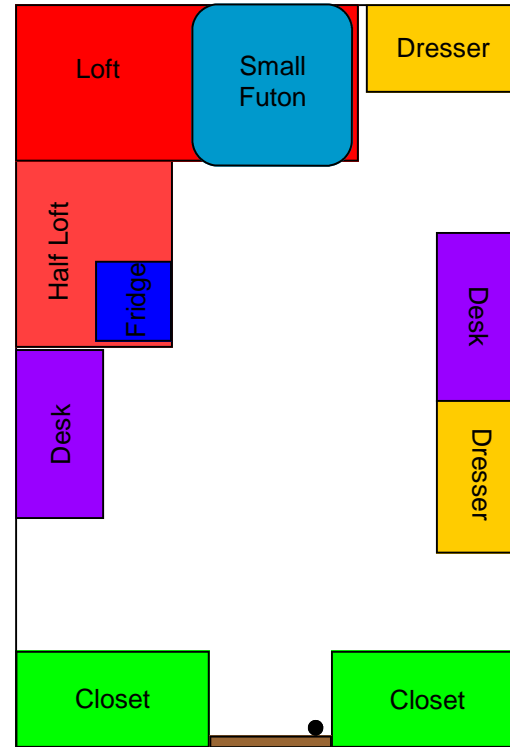


## Description

# Sara and Kate's Room



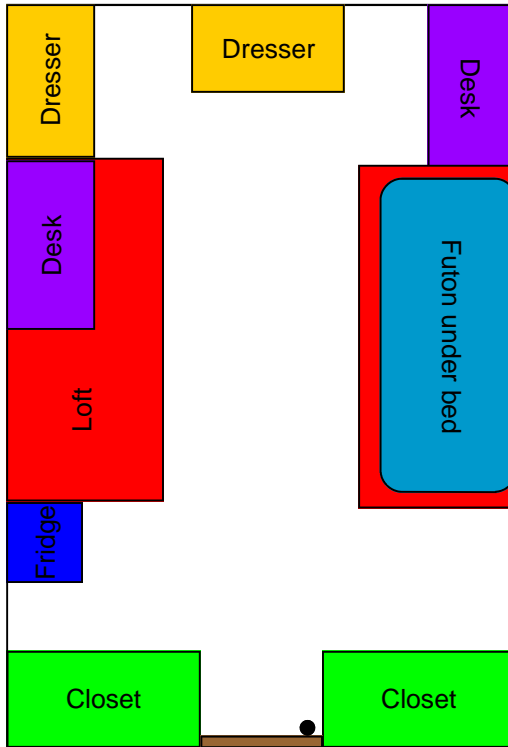
## Description

## Mike and Hamid's Room

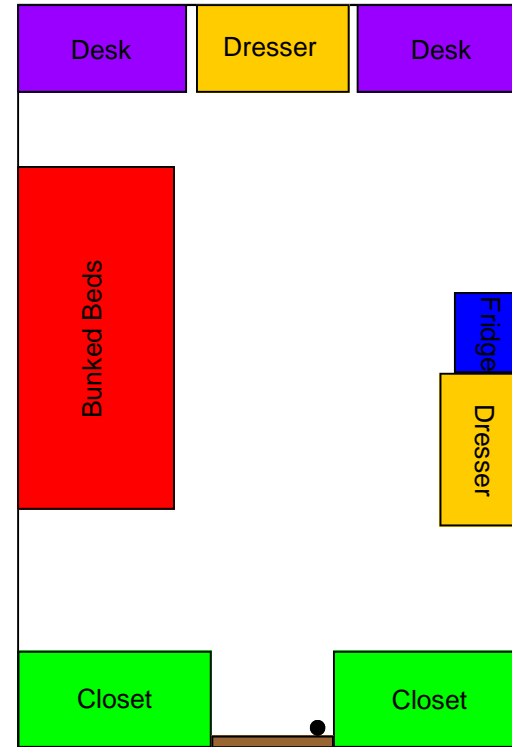


### Description

Taking a new spin on a very common layout, this setup has the advantage of maximizing space by lofting the beds, and creating a nice entertainment area. One desk is partially cut off from the center of the room to minimize distraction, while the other is placed to easily see the TV from your computer.



## Dan and Mark's Room

This set up makes good use of the space near the window, and also allows for each person to use the middle dresser as additional desk space, which is great for putting your printer on. The bottom bed doubles as a couch for watching TV or just sitting around and talking.
