COMES NOW THE AFFIANT SWORN AND STATES THE FOLLOWING:

1. My name is Alex Richards, and I am the president of the Chi Si Chapter of 2 Epsilon Sigma Epsilon honors society here at Daniel Morgan University. I turned 22 on 3 December 9, 2009. During the school year I live at the ESE house at Daniel Morgan 4 University. During the summer I typically travel out of the country to see more of the 5 world. I am a senior with a 4.0 GPA, and have already been accepted to law school 6 once I graduate. I have been in ESE for three years now. I was elected pledge master 7 for a year before running for and being elected president of the chapter.

9 2. Though we have Greek letters identifying us, much as the traditional 10 fraternities and sororities do, we are guite a bit different. First, we are co-ed. Second, 11 we have much higher GPA standards than any of those groups. And finally, we do true 12 services for the community. We have a few other things in common with the traditional Greek organizations on campus. Our officers are all required by the University to attend 13 14 the same trainings as traditional Greek organizations. We are an organization that gains membership by invitation only based on brains; not necessarily beauty or popularity. 15 I have greatly enjoyed my time here at Daniel Morgan University. I have worked hard to 16 17 move up through the ranks of the ESE honors society. This year, I became president of the Chapter, and had some great plans for the year. Things have really derailed since 18 19 then.

Taylor Durden joined ESE at the same time that I did. Taylor was always
 more happy working with the new members, or pledges as they are often called. Taylor

just loved the process of screening and admitting new members, and some of the fun
things to build unity within ESE. Taylor learned the ropes of being the pledge master like
I did, from Jessica's older brother Colt. Colt put us through the paces of the Water
Jeopardy game. Taylor was miserable after we were done that day, but Taylor and Colt
became fast friends after the experience. They began to hang out all the time together.
I am willing to bet Taylor was with Colt when the University Police golf cart was stolen.

4. Every year there is a type of ESE Pledge Olympics. All of the ESE officers review the proposed activities to make sure that we do not run into trouble with the University's hazing policies. Until this year, we have never even had a visit from the University Police Department, much less been sanctioned in any way by DMU Administration. Last year when I was pledge master, everyone had a great time and nobody died from Water Jeopardy. It is awful that Taylor cannot say the same this year.

37 5. This year, Taylor seemed fixated on pushing the pledges further than we had before. I said it was not a good idea and even thought the Water Jeopardy that Taylor 38 39 was so fond of was probably close to hazing. I even told Taylor about a lady I had read 40 about dying from drinking too much water and not going to the bathroom as a part of a 41 radio contest to win a Nintendo Wii. Taylor insisted that Water Jeopardy was not hazing 42 because it was voluntary and that nobody was told they could not go to the bathroom, 43 but that s/he would call the University Student Affairs Office to ask. I have no idea if 44 Taylor ever did call, or what they even said. Either way, Taylor said s/he was moving 45 forward with the Water Jeopardy. We argued about it, and I decided that I did not want 46 to be present for the game. I probably should have double checked behind Taylor, but I had been busy settling back into the fall semester routine. I was around for most of the 47 48 other pledge week activities, and they all seemed to go pretty well. Everyone was 49 having a good time, especially with the shaving cream fight.

6. When the Water Jeopardy game started, I headed upstairs to my room to study. After awhile, I heard Tammy Canes yelling for a phone and to call 911. Tammy looked lost wandering around the house when I came downstairs and I realized that she had never been inside the main portion of the house since she was just a pledge. I called 911, while asking what the problem was. Tammy said that one of the pledges passed out. That happens to people from time to time, but they could not get her to

57 wake up. That scared me. I went down to the basement level with Tammy, and we 58 opened up the outside doors of the basement and everyone waited on EMS. Taylor and 59 a couple others were trying to wake Jessica up the whole time. EMS arrived, and took Jessica out on a stretcher. She had been a quiet and somewhat silly person, and was 60 not taking the pledge process seriously enough for Taylor all week long. I am sure that 61 62 Taylor was punishing her with Water Jeopardy. The cop thought it might have been an alcohol poisoning and hazing incident, since it was pledge week all over campus. 63 64 Before Sgt. Knight left, Taylor and I were interviewed about what happened. Sgt. Knight asked if it was okay to search the house for alcohol since there were appearances that 65 alcohol could be involved. Taylor and I both told the cop to feel free to search the 66 house, so Sgt. Knight and Cpl. Dechane did. They of course did not find anything. 67 I found out later that evening from the University Director of Student Affairs that Jessica 68 died. 69

71 7. A couple days later, Sgt. Knight and another officer came back to the house and said that Water Jeopardy was considered hazing and manslaughter. They said the 72 73 water was forced on Jessica and that she died from the excessive water and it was our fault. They arrested Taylor for it, and took me down to an interview room at the police 74 department. I was told that because I was the chapter president and it happened while 75 76 I was responsible for the honors society, that I could be held responsible too. The police 77 gave me a choice. I could sit at the prosecution table or the defense table. You do not 78 have to have a 4.0 in aerospace engineering to realize the implications of that decision. 79 I am sure it was Taylor's meanness and pushing events too far that got Jessica Bateson 80 killed. I am sitting at the right table.
